Firstly our 3-6 camp was a great success. Thank you to parent volunteers Mel Crouch and Craig Clark for supporting our teachers and our students. We are very grateful, and the feedback from students and teachers was overwhelmingly positive.

NAPLAN results have been published and it is a testament to all the staff at Jervois and the quality teaching and learning that is happening every day. Our improvement has been consistent over the past three years, and this is due to a number of reasons, however I believe in our consistent approach to rigorous instructional routines, and teachers delivering a guaranteed curriculum are certainly the foundation of improvement.

You may have seen a survey on social media or Seesaw asking families about their needs around school based OSCH. The Department for Education is seeking feedback to determine whether this would best suit the community. I would encourage everyone who is able, to complete the survey.

Jervois has a Playgroup! The survey closes midnight Sunday 8 September.



Great writing Hudson!







## Register now for reception in 2025! In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception. Children who turn 5 years old: before 1 May can start school in term 1 between 1 May and 31 October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake) after 31 October can start the next year. Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception. Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception. Register your interest for 2025 Registrations of interest are now open to start school in 2025. 

# Does your child have OCD?

Has your child been diagnosed with Obsessive-Compulsive Disorder, OR experienced unwanted, intrusive thoughts, and perform certain behaviours over and over again to prevent those thoughts from coming true?

Researchers at Macquarie University are investigating the needs of families of children aged 4-18 with OCD from minority backgrounds.

Participants will complete an anonymous online survey that will take roughly 30 minutes and may be invited to an online interview that will take roughly 60 minutes.
