YEL – Term 3 Forum

Richard, Hunter & James went with Samantha to the Term 3 YEL forum, held at the Wetlands to learn about 'Species Survival'.

Richard's report:

'We went on a walk around the wetlands; on the way back we went up the side of the cliff. We found some owl pellets, which are the remains (bones etc) from what the owls ate. We had to look at different animal 'poo' and try to decipher which animals they came from – I wasn't really into that, it was gross! In the wetlands, they control the amount of carp in the river and predators in the area (eg cats). Some animals they use for pest control are special types of birds (like the kite & raptor). This all helps with native & endangered species survival.'





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Maker's Empire Challenge

A group of students from both Yr 3-4 & 5-6 represented JPS with Jayde & Chloe at the Maker's Empire: RAA Street Smart Primary Road Safety Project Showcase. The event is the culmination of nearly two terms work in this project. It was an opportunity for students and teachers to share and celebrate their design thinking projects with an authentic audience. RAA and Makers Empire joined forces to deliver a pioneering and engaging program designed to promote awareness of road safety and empower students as problem solvers.

Let's hear all about it from our students who attended: Chloe, Frankie, Miyah & Arabella from the 3/4 class; and Scarlett, Sophie, Marcus & Archer from the 5/6 class.

'In class we went on Maker's Empire to do the RAA Road safety course'

What we designed: 'a tray for food'; 'new stop signs'; 'phone jail to put in a car'; 'a bag holder for the back of the bus seat'.

'A problem we found was how we needed to find/make an original design that wasn't already invented. We resolved it by researching about already made creations so we didn't make it by accident'.

'At the presentation, we got to go up on stage'.

'Team 3 from St Joseph's won the peer selected trophy and then Io & behold.....the Jervois team was announced for the professional trophy: picked by the RAA, Maker's Empire and Health Care workers' – HOW AWESOME!

'We got our own orange 3D printed trophy and it was so much fun'!

'It was great to go around and see others' amazing products especially the ones I never thought of'!

The best bits about the day: 'the free food' (!); 'when we got the trophy'; 'the donuts & juice'; 'getting to tell my ideas with other people'; 'stamping other school students'

Sounds like a great way to celebrate an awesome learning project.....and to come away with an award was amazing – well done to everyone!
